## SCAN TO VIEW THE APPLICATION FORM



A forwarder is a forestry vehicle used in timber harvesting that carries logs from the stump to a roadside landing. Unlike a skidder, a forwarder carries logs clear of the ground, which can reduce soil impacts. Forwarders are typically employed together with harvesters in cut-to-length logging operations.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- No previous machine operating experience is necessary.
- Applicants must demonstrate their ability and willingness to train for 10 hours/day in Quesnel for 20 days in total in July and August 2021.

There is a potential for employment after the training is complete. There are only 3 seats available this summer, and all other applicants will be added to a list for future training opportunities.
