

Snapshot on Accessory Dwelling Units

In Quesnel, Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) includes secondary suites, carriage houses and secondary dwellings. ADUs are permitted in residential zones on lots with single-detached homes. Secondary suites are also permitted in duplexes and row houses.

Thinking of developing a suite, carriage house or secondary dwelling in Quesnel?

Here is what you need to know/consider:

- A Building Permit is required for the development of an ADU.
- Have you considered servicing requirements and feasibility?
- Do you already have building plans or are you planning to use the City's pre-reviewed plans?
- Are you prepared to be a landlord? Investigate your rights and responsibilities to a tenant in the Residential Tenancy Act.
- We encourage you to contact the City Planner and Building Inspector to discuss your plans and our property's zoning.

What if I already have a built-in suite?

If you have a pre-existing suite that was constructed without a building permit, it was built illegally. This can lead to issues such as safety (both for your tenant and you), insurance protection, home value, and penalties upon complaint. Your suite must be legalized or decommissioned.







What are the various types of Accessory Dwelling Units?

Secondary Suites


Secondary Suite in a Single Detached Dwelling

Secondary Suites in side-by-side Row Houses




Carriage House
